



New Campus Update

- In October, two additional lanes of Port Republic Road are expected to open, starting at the Stone Spring connector and going as far as the Church of the Nazarene at the corner of Boyers Road and Port Republic Road, said Dennis Coffman, director, Facilities Planning and Development. Traffic will be re-routed onto these additional lanes while workers add the final improvements to the existing two lanes of Port Republic at the entrance to the new hospital. "Everything is running on schedule," he said.
- RMH has placed a lit mobile sign at the Port Republic entrance to the

campus. While work to widen the road near the hospital entrance is ongoing, this temporary signage will remain in place. A permanent sign will be installed when grading work is complete by the end of September, Coffman said.

- Additional signage on the RMH campus directing visitors to the Emergency Department is also being placed, in response to patient requests. "Our current signage features the Emergency Department listed at the top," Coffman said. "What we're finding is most folks in a stressful situation look at eye-level first, so we are modifying signage accordingly."

Additional ED signage will be in place within 30-60 days.

- RMH has submitted its application to the U.S. Green Building Council for Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Silver Certification. The hospital's application is currently being reviewed, and the council's response is expected soon.
- RMH has partnered with the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) to identify locations for additional signage featuring the blue "H" (hospital) signs to be placed on Routes 11, 33, 42 and Interstate 81.



Southeast Connector Now Open

The portion of the Southeast Connector that crosses RMH property is now open for traffic. This roadway replaces the detour on Reservoir Street. The portion of Reservoir Street that previously connected to Port Republic Road has now been converted to a residential street, re-named Albert Long Drive, and is closed to thru-traffic. Traffic from Reservoir to Port Republic Road will now be routed across the Stone Spring connector crossing the RMH campus.



Reclamation Sale Scheduled for August 13-15
